

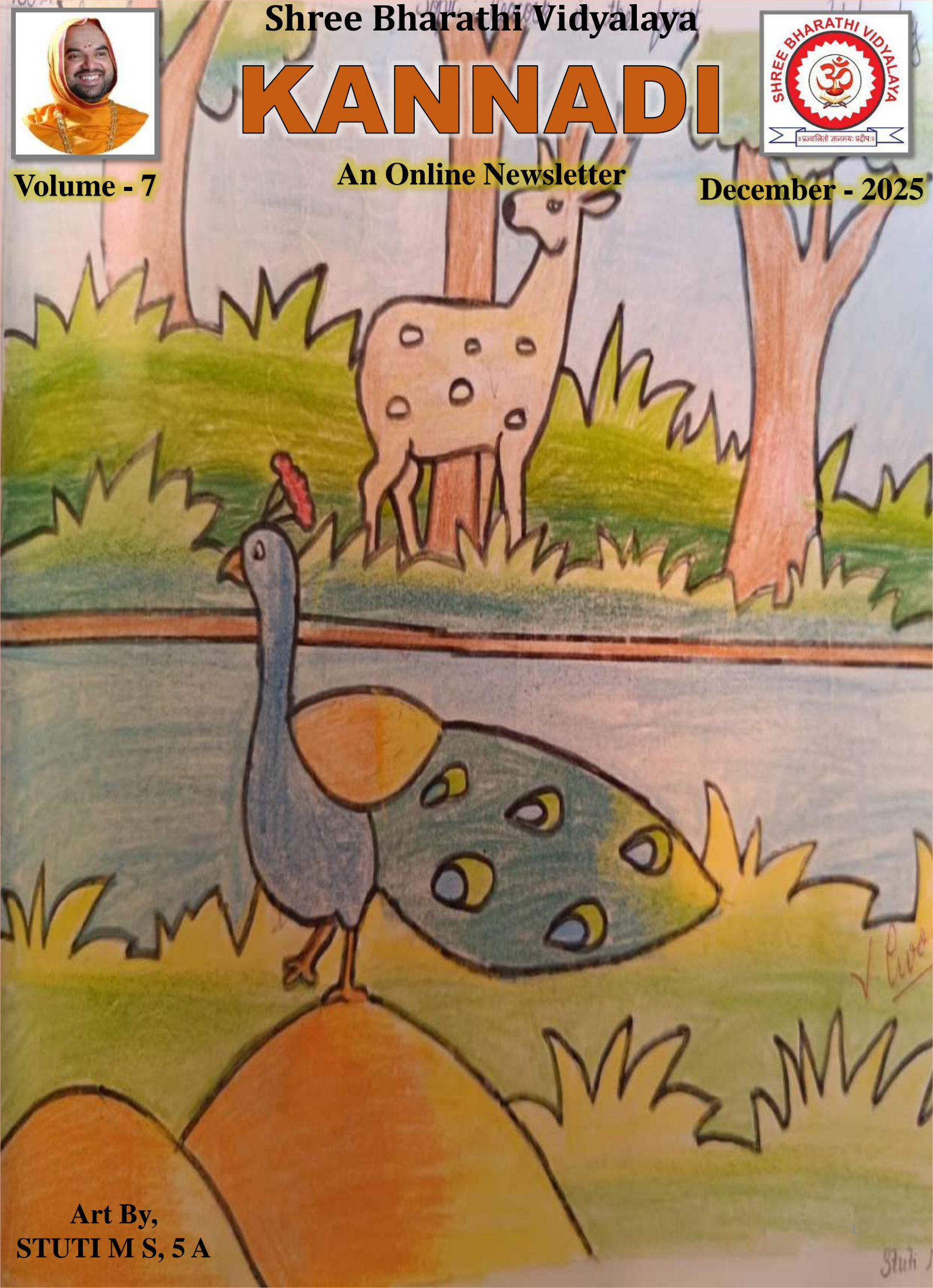

FIELD TRIP

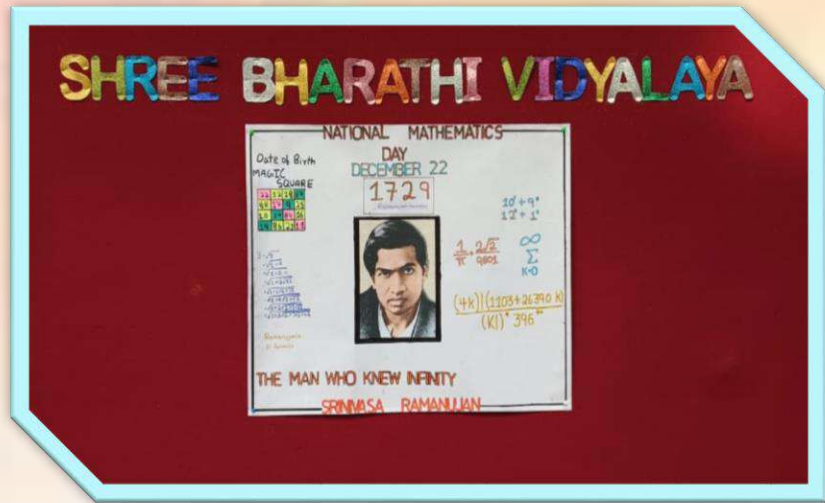

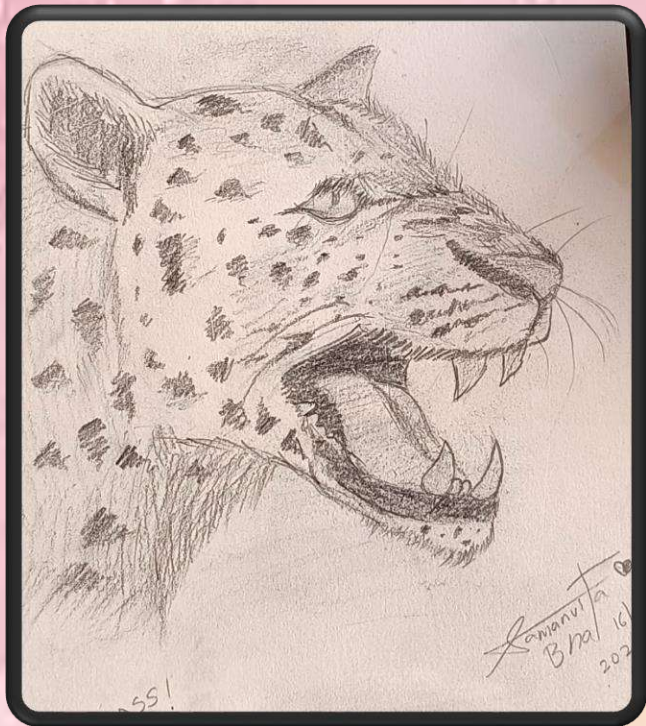

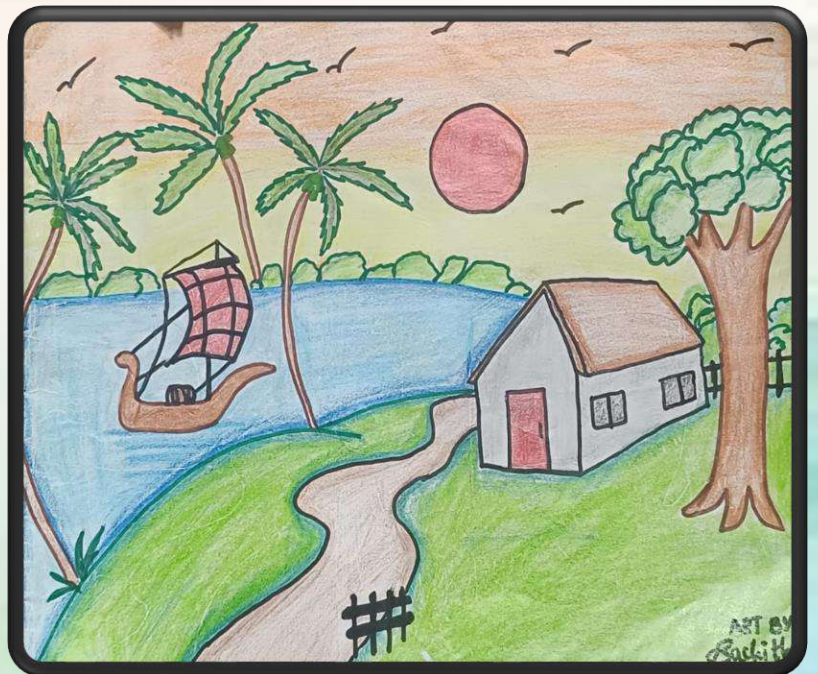
