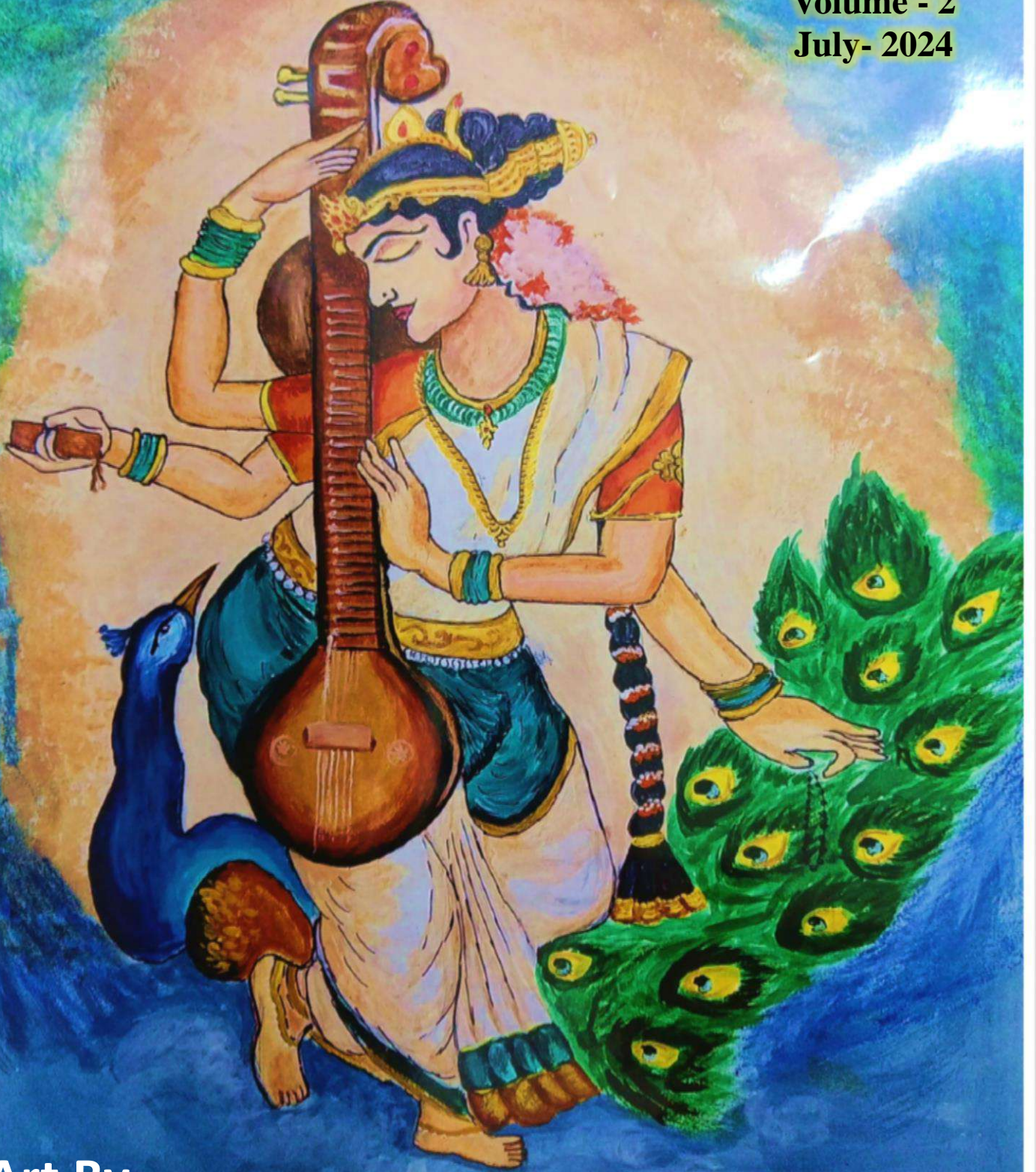

English Debate

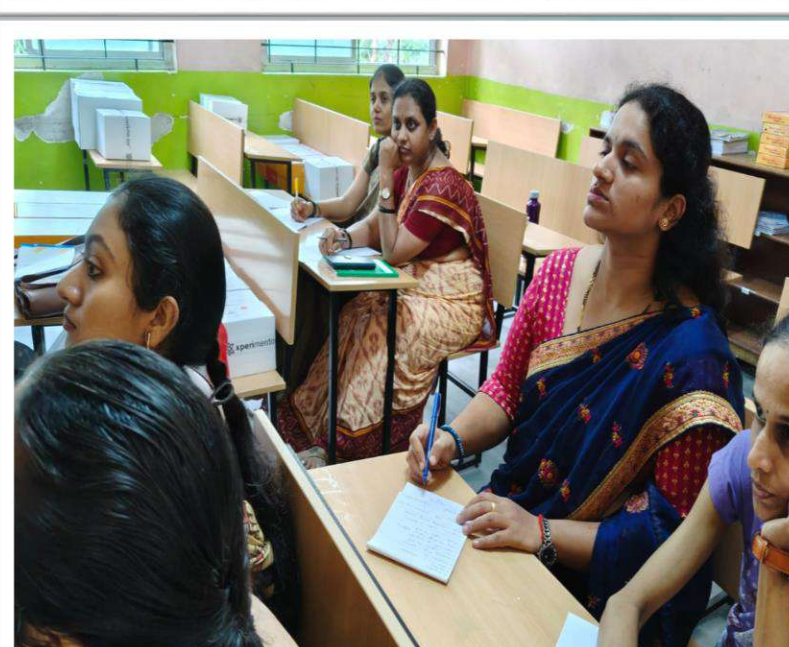

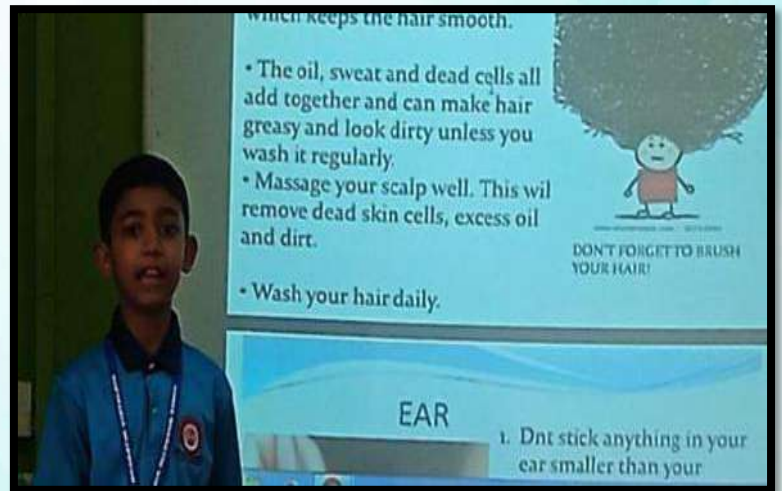

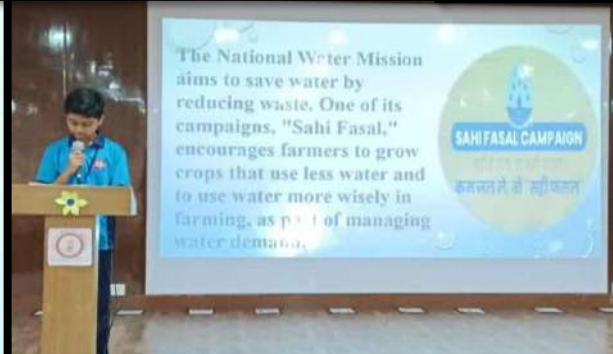
Assembly activity – Class 8B

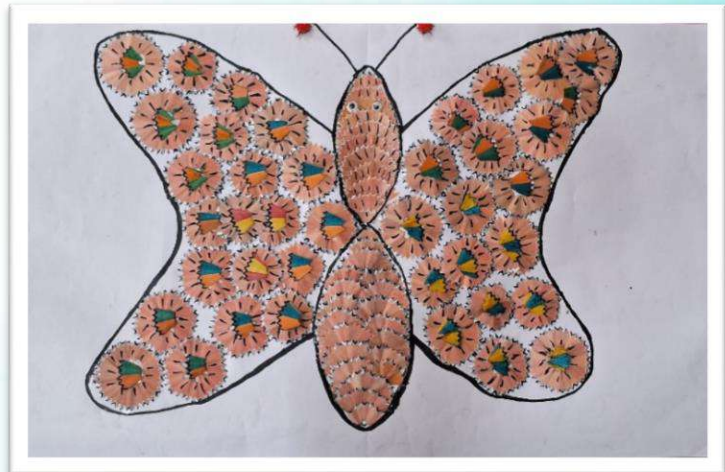
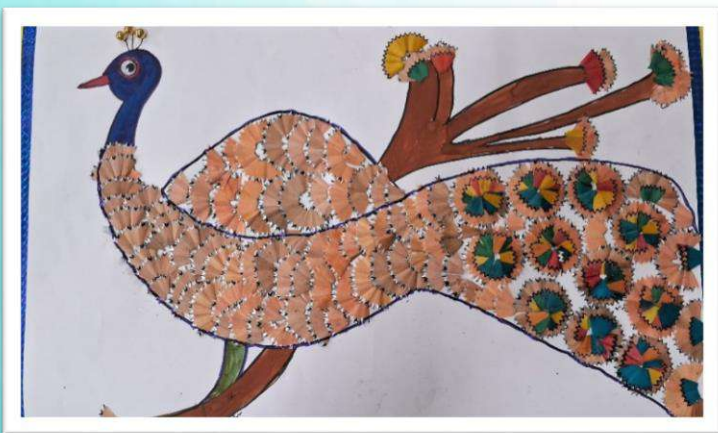

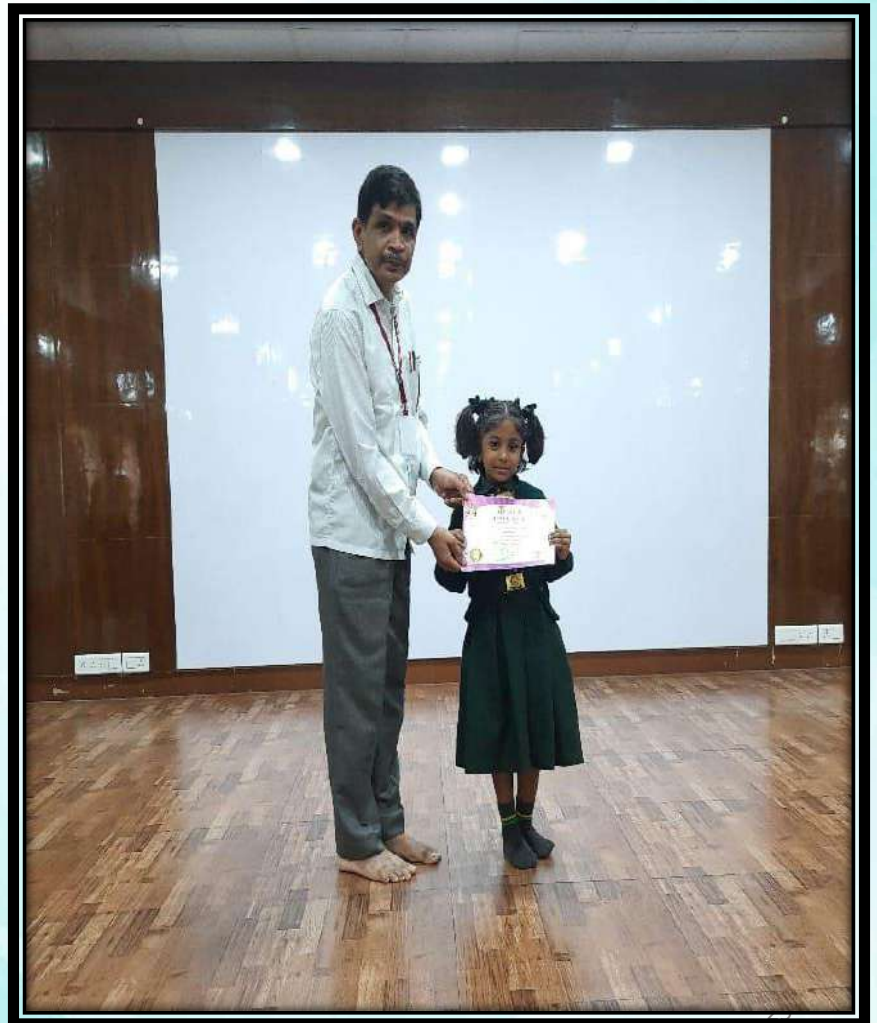

World Population Day

“World of 8 billion is both a challenge and an opportunity”

Choosing when and how many and empowering individuals for sustainable future is a great task faced by the Vasudha. Population has become a problem in the society as it is costing mother earth everything and isn't thinking about the consequences which will be faced by the coming generations.

By this the 'United Nations' started observing the World Population Day. This annual event aims to raise awareness about population-related issues and to focus attention on their urgency and importance in the context of comprehensive development plans and programs.

11th July of every year is observed as World Population Day. It was suggested by Dr KC Zachariah when the world population had reached 5 billion. It was first observed in 1989. The program highlights population related concerns such as reproductive health, family planning, gender equality etc. By recognizing the challenges and opportunities presented by population dynamics, World Population Day provides a platform for governments, organizations, and individuals to engage in discussions and take action. Through this observance, the United Nations promotes understanding, collaboration, and innovative solutions to ensure a sustainable future for all countries.

Base of Population and its Challenges.

The base of population is the fertility rate which is 2.410 births per woman which leads to around 3 lakh 85 thousand births per day and 140 million births in a year according to the UN. This is a huge problem which is the main reason for over population. Nigeria records the highest fertility rate of 7 babies per woman. However, India has the highest population in the world and not enough area to accommodate everyone comfortably. It is equivalent to 17.76% of world population.

Challenges faced by the most populated countries.

India, being the most populated country, is facing many problems which are obvious but there are twice the number of problems which are we don't know about, but are the major challenges faced by the government. The problems known to us are as follows:

1. Unemployment
2. Pressure on Infrastructure
3. Decreased food production
4. Environmental harm
5. Less utility
6. Rapid spread of diseases

Others being communalism, poverty due to corruption, illiteracy due to poverty, child marriage, prostitution, economic inequality, profiteering, corruption, smuggling etc are some of the disputes which we know but not able to correct

Unemployment: It is the most observed issue which is spiking due to over population in India and many populated countries. In India, due to less scope for sectors other than engineering, doctorate, civil services and many commerce field jobs, we are not able generate employment in our country which is a (main) reason for unemployment. The number) of engineers graduating is 1.5 million per year. Among them, it is about 64% of people who get an opportunity to work in a stable job. Similarly, the other sectors mentioned above are in the same situation. This is also a cause for other problems like prostitution, economic inequality etc.

Pressure on Infrastructure: Ignoring the unemployment for the time being we also have the responsibility to provide infrastructure to employers, their companies and other community buildings for the well-being of the citizens. But as the number of employers and civilians are more, we have a great challenge in our hands. The infrastructure which is provided is being misused by people with power leading to corruption and smuggling. Not only the infrastructure but also, we have earnest shortage of food resources.

These are the two main issues/problems which are the main reasons for the existence of other issues listed. As the people move from villages to cities hoping to get a job or settle their life, people forget their main role as farmer or a labourer who is the 'Annadata' to the world. Due to this, if the population density increases in the cities, the government will take an initiative to develop the city in terms of area. This leads to land grabbing and deforestation and thus becomes an environmental threat.

The government has taken measures to decrease this threat but there are many lacunae.

For all of these issues related to population the UN is attempting to find answers every year through this memorable day.
