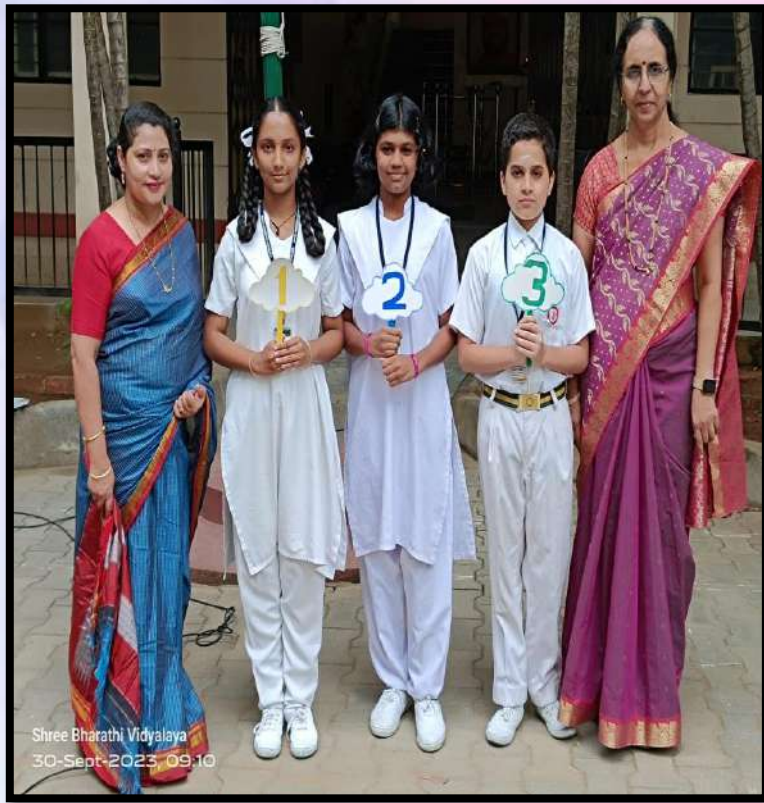

Mahatma Gandhi – The Father of India

Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi, popularly known as Mahatma Gandhi was a prominent leader of the Indian Independence movement against British rule. His principles of non-violence (Ahimsa) and Satyagraha (Passive non-violent resistance) played a significant role in India's struggle for freedom. Here, we delve into the life and legacy of this remarkable figure.

Early Life

Gandhi was born on October 2, 1869, in Porbandar, in Gujarat, India. Gandhiji's father was Karamchand Gandhi, the Diwan of the Porbandar state. Gandhiji's mother is Putlibai. Gandhiji's upbringing was heavily influenced by his devout Hindu mother and the Jain traditions of his family. After studying law in London, he becomes a barrister and embarked on his professional career in South Africa.

South-Africa and Birth of Satyagraha

Gandhiji worked in South Africa as a barrister and set up an organisation called the Natal Indian Ambulance Corps, which helped the British troops as stretcher bears during the Anglo-Boer War. After the war the organisation was then converted to the Natal Indian Congress. Gandhiji faced racial discrimination. It was in the Natal Indian Congress where Gandhiji first tested the concept 'Satyagraha'.

It was successful and motivated Gandhiji to use it more commonly. One event made Gandhiji to move back to India and to fight against the injustice of the British.

Return to India and the Fight for Independence

Gandhiji returned to India in 1915, after he was convinced by Gopal Krishna Gokhale to return. He began to advocate for civil rights and self-rule, marking the start of his involvement in the Indian freedom struggle. His first movements were the Champaran (1917), Kheda (1918) and Ahmedabad (1918) where his principle of Satyagraha worked successfully.

Non-violence and Civil Disobedience

Gandhiji's most powerful weapons were in his commitment to non-violence and civil disobedience. His campaigns, such as the Salt March and Quit India Movement, mobilized millions of Indians in peaceful protests against British Oppression.

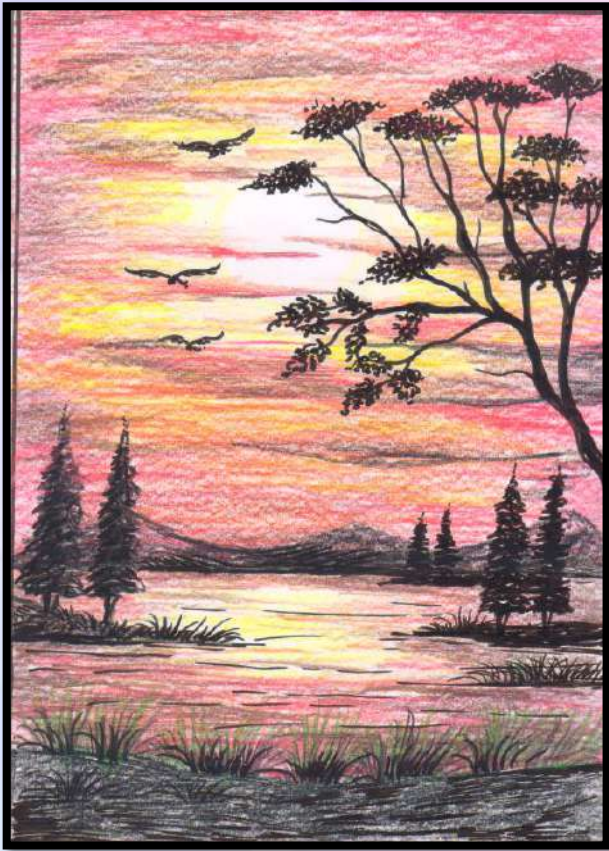
Conclusion
