According to the World Health Organization, approximately 1.19 million people die on the world's roads each year. More than half of all road traffic deaths involve vulnerable road users, i.e., pedestrians, cyclists, and motorcyclists.

## **RPC Layout, Hampinagar**

RPC Layout in Hampinagar, like many rapidly developing urban residential areas, presents a microcosm of India's broader road safety challenges. While the area offers the convenience of connectivity and a bustling community, residents frequently face a daily gauntlet of traffic issues that compromise safety for pedestrians, two-wheelers, and even car users.

### **1. Local Authorities (BBMP, Traffic Police):**

1. Strict enforcement against encroachment and illegal parking.
2. Installation and maintenance of clear signage, traffic signals at key junctions, and effective traffic-calming measures (speed breakers, rumble strips).
3. Development and repair of safe, unobstructed footpaths.
4. Regular patrolling and enforcement against speeding and reckless driving.
5. Improving street lighting.

### **2. Residents' Welfare Associations (RWAs):**

1. Actively engage with local authorities to highlight specific problem areas and advocate for solutions.
2. Organize awareness campaigns on responsible parking, pedestrian safety, and helmet use.
3. Encourage community participation in reporting violations and identifying dangerous spots.

### **3. Individual Road Users:**

1. Drivers: Adhere to speed limits, avoid distractions, give way to pedestrians, and park responsibly.
2. Two-Wheeler Riders: Always wear helmets (both rider and passenger), follow traffic rules, and avoid rash driving.

## **Doing Our Part**

We, the road safety ambassadors, have organized and executed many events, with assistance from teachers and trainers, on road safety — such as rallies, street plays, making observation and recommendation videos, and giving presentations on the importance of road safety.
